



Music In Multimedia

 Music in Film and Television Through various classroom experiences, students and their like-minded peers from other schools will discover music through the following components:

Music Studies

An understanding of the musical concepts and contexts of the five AoSs

Music Writing

Competence in and understanding of the process of composing

Performing

Technical competence on an instrument

Students get to form meaningful and lasting bonds with their peers through collaborative music learning.

Selection Exercise: G3 Music course (2026-2027)

What are the two components of the Selection Exercise?

- Component 1: Audition (online video submission)
- Component 2: e-Listening Test (in person in school)

Do I require external music certification (e.g. ABRSM) to be eligible for the G3 Music course?

No. Certifications from external examination boards are not required.

Selection Exercise: G3 Music course (2026-2027)

What am I expected to fulfil in Component 1 Audition?

- Perform and video-record two contrasting solo pieces on an instrument/voice, lasting <u>no longer</u> than five minutes in total.
- Submit the link(s) to the video-recording(s) online by **16 July 2025**. Refer to the <u>Information Sheet for Applicants</u> (pages 2 to 3) for details on the video-recording submission.

What is the expected performing standard for Component 1 Audition to qualify for the G3 Music course?

Applicants are expected to be fluent in playing their instruments (including voice) and to exhibit sound fundamental technique. Applicants are encouraged to:

- learn the notes and rhythm well;
- have good tempo control, tone production and execution of technique;
- demonstrate sensitivity to the expression and style as well as score markings or improvisation skills suitable to the musical tradition;
- select repertoire that would allow them to showcase the best of their abilities.

Selection Exercise: G3 Music course (2026-2027)

What does Component 2 comprise?

- •8 10 short musical extracts from Western and non-Western musical traditions with 25 multiple-choice questions.
- Refer to the Information Sheet for Applicants (Page 3) for details on the scope of questions.

What knowledge is required for Component 2?

The e-Listening Test is intended to assess applicants' basic musical knowledge. Staff notation is the prevalent notation used and an understanding of music theory fundamentals (e.g. key signature, time signature, scales) is required. Refer to the <u>Information Sheet for Applicants</u> (Page 3) for details on the scope of questions.
